Elizabeth Keckley, Dressmaker to Mary Todd Lincoln

Revonne Hammond will bring to life Elizabeth Keckley, a former slave who became a successful seamstress, civil activist, and author in Washington, DC. She was best known as the personal modiste and confidante of Mary Todd Lincoln, the First Lady. Keckley moved to Washington in 1860 after buying her freedom and that of her son.

Hammond holds a bachelor's degree from Liberty State College in West Virginia, a Master's in education from Marygrove College in Detroit, and has been teaching in the Columbus School system since 1992. She began volunteering at the Ohio History Center



around 2010 and is now a first-person interpreter where she has performed in the "Echoes in Time Theater" researching her characters while writing her own scripts. Her initial role was Mary Elizabeth Bowser, a spy in the confederate White House.

After her presentation Hammond will be happy to entertain questions from the attendees.

President Michael V. Drake is the 15th president since Ohio State's founding in 1870. While he recently announced his retirement, Drake plans to continue to lead the University as a new presidential search commences.

His focus has been on strengthening Ohio State's position as a national flagship public research university in five strategic areas:: teaching and learning; access, affordability and excellence; research and creative expression; academic health care; and operational excellence and resource stewardship.

During his tenure, the university has seen record highs in applications, graduation rates, academic excellence, diversity and

donor support. Additionally, it has received national recognition for its commitment to teaching and learning as well as excellence in patient safety and clinical outcomes at The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center.

Dr. Drake has been a leader in higher education for nearly four decades, serving as chancellor of the University of California, Irvine, for nine years prior to Ohio State. He is an elected member of the National Academy of Medicine and the American Academy of Arts & Sciences. He is chair of the Association of Public and Land-grant Universities, past-chair of the Association of American Universities, vice-chair of the Big Ten Conference Council of Presidents/Chancellors and a member of the NCAA Division I Board of Directors.

Elise "Lee" Mills, 1925 – 2018 Last year we overlooked the passing of our dedicated member Lee Mills. Lee left a long, generous and humanitarian legacy whether she was living abroad or in the states. She played a key role, beginning in the 1960s, by developing programs for the wives of international

OSU students. Lee and her husband Bob, along with several other couples, initiated an international dinner group, bringing foreign students into the homes of local families for formal dinner parties. In 1991, OSU recognized Lee and Bob for their foreign student outreach by presenting them with the International Community Service Award of the OSU Office of International Affairs. This is just a single example of her commitment to making OSU a warmer and more welcoming place. Her memory will be treasured by all who knew her.

The bracelet is joined together by two small screws. We had the gold tested and the bracelet is clearly marked inside. The bracelet we have does not have its companion screwdriver, however, an eyeglass screwdriver will work just fine.

We would like to offer it to our UWC members before we try to sell it through another vendor. The pre-owned bracelet sells online for \$3995-\$5000. Luncheon Notes

We are thrilled that so many members have used our revamped website for luncheon registration. However, please take care when making your reservations online and be sure to register for the correct luncheon.

Over the past year, on several occasions, members have unintentionally registered for the wrong luncheon. When this happens, confusion ensues, at the luncheon as it appears that the member did not register for the upcoming luncheon and consequently, they don't show up on our "paid list."

After some detective work, we've unscrambled the problem and figured out how it happens, but the trouble plays out at the luncheon registration table. Members arrive thinking they have paid, their name doesn't appear on the registration list and there is no way to resolve the discrepancy at that time. We are working on a better solution for our website to ensure the online registration process is streamlined so these errors don't happen in the future.

One final note: when registering online for a luncheon, make sure you complete all the steps—all the way to end to the point where you print out a receipt (please feel free to bring receipt to luncheon). This will prove which luncheon you are paid. (Please feel free to bring receipt to the luncheon.)

Bylaws Update

The General Membership will vote to approve bylaw changes in February (or possibly March) during the Lunch and Learn. The following were approved by the Executive Committee on October 28, 2018 and presented for approval to the Governing Board in January 2020. The UWC Executive Committee requested that the Long Range Planning Committee (LRP) consider four bylaw changes. It was determined by LRP that two of the recommended changes were unnecessary because they are covered in the current bylaws.

Two other requested changes were processed as follows:

1. Requested change:

"Rewrite the definition of 'Member in Good Standing' to include payment of dues, payment of all other Club fees and assessments." Change to bylaw is below.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 5. Requirements for Good Standing

Any individual who has paid dues and all other Club fees and assessments for the current year, or is a courtesy member, is considered to be a Member in Good Standing.

2. Requested change:

"Implement a bylaw on how to enforce a remedy to any violation of the stated Conflict of Interest, Bylaws, and Duty Sheets."

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

Section 6. A member deemed to have violated the UWC Conflict of Interest statement, Bylaws, or *Duty Sheets* will, first, be referred to the Membership Chair for discussion of membership responsibilities. If the issue cannot be resolved by the Membership Chair, it will be referred to the Executive Committee for possible termination according to the procedure used for removal of an Elected Officer, **as found in ARTICLE VI ELECTED OFFICERS, Section V D.**
